Please briefly describe the context and objectives of your research. For artistic practices, indicate the sphere of interests that have inspired it, the creative process, format and media employed, and at what point of your art career you produced it.

Lanchonete is a five-year journey into community, one that culminates in and around a typical lanchonete in the center of São Paulo, Brazil. By delving deep into a site-specific interpretation of globalization, such as Brazilianification, a term that describes the disappearing middle class and widening gulf between upper and lower classes, Lanchonete asks the universal question 'How do we live with money?' "The essential function of utopia," says Ernst Bloch to Theodor Adorno, "is a critique of what is present." Business as Trojan horse, Lanchonete learns from, plays with, and rigorously interrogates the utopic template of artist residency.

'Fei\$hoada' is the present, itinerant form of the Lanchonete project; this meme manifests as a Wednesday or Saturday discussion or happening at various art events, cultural gatherings and key moments around the world, approximately once a quarter from 2013-2015.

As R&D for Lanchonete, these itinerant events comprise the first half of a five-year experiment in artistic witnessing, one that begs an overriding question in São Paulo and similar places ... How do we live with money?

Todd Lester has worked in leadership, advocacy and strategic communications roles at Reporters sans frontiers, the Astraea Lesbian Justice Foundation, and most recently as the Executive Director of the Global Arts Corps, an organization that creates theatre to advance reconciliation in societies emerging from violent conflict. He founded freeDimensional, an organization that helps activists-in-distress by providing safe haven in artist residencies. He has dedicated periods of his career to work on microfinance in Cameroon, refugee rights in Egypt, post-genocide reconciliation in Rwanda, Track II diplomacy in the Southern Caucasus, at-risk youth engagement in Brazil, and the North-South Peace Accord in Sudan working with organizations such as CARE, International Rescue Committee, Carter Center, Peace Corps, Population Services International, Dutch Refugee Council, and the United Nations. Todd holds a Masters of Public Administration from Rutgers University and diplomas from the Summer School in Forced Migration at Oxford University and Film & Media Studies at the New School. Todd received the Peace Corps Fund Award for founding freeDimensional; was named Architect of the Future by the Waldzell Institute; and serves as a Senior Fellow at the World Policy Institute where he leads the Arts-Policy Nexus initiative. His new project, Lanchonete.org, is a 5-year experiment in artistic witnessing focused on a neighborhood in the center of São Paulo.
