RU artist Debora Hirsch (2018, Brazil/Italy) works across media in painting, video, performance and installation. Her recent two-minute video *Camminata Lenta* consists of a sequence of images produced while in mandatory isolation that questions our existence and moment in time. Art Select is holding its first Webinar today (Wednesday), on the effects of COVID-19 on the Bahrain Art Scene. Moderated by journalist Rebecca Anne Proctor, the panelists include RU artist Hisham Sharif (2020, Bahrain), Marwa Rashid Al Khalifa, and Salman Al Najem. Hisham was among the 14 residents forced to return home due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Guided by both emotion and technique, his painting moves between daily scenes and memories of his heritage, combining time and collapsed recorded visual images with pictorial memory. Hisham's residency was made possible with support from Art Select, a Bahrainbased art advisory, consulting and creating artist platforms, art events and investor art portfolios.



