



Residency Unlimited (RU) is a non-profit organization located at 360 Court Street in the nave of a former church in the historic neighborhood of Carroll Gardens, Brooklyn. Our mission is to support the creative process and promote exchange and diversity through our unique customized residency program and year-round public programs for U.S.-based and international artists and curators.







RU 's headquarters are multifunctional. The ground floor is a shared work space for resident artists and curators.

On the mezzanine level is a dedicated space for weekly one-on-one meetings between artists and arts professionals that are organized by RU.

RU hosts approximately 50 residencies each year for a duration of two to six months each.

Enhanced network support is a signature feature of RU's residency program. Prior to arrival, incoming artist and curator residents respond to a questionnaire about their goals and needs while in residence at RU. In 2017, we invited 180 New York-based and visiting arts professionals, including curators, gallerists, and critics to meet one-on-one with artists and provide critical feedback.



RU provides project support including access to free materials from Material for the Arts, New York City's premier creative reuse center. RU's Project Manager meets each artist upon arrival to discuss objectives, provide guidance and feasibility advice. New work produced at RU is featured in a group exhibition or presented in a public program.






