The residency offers 24-hour access to a furnished studio with WiFi, the opportunity to present work to curators and critics through AAI-organized studio visits, a solo exhibition at Cuchifritos Gallery + Project Space (inside the Essex Market), and monthly stipends (*awarded to New York State residents only*).
