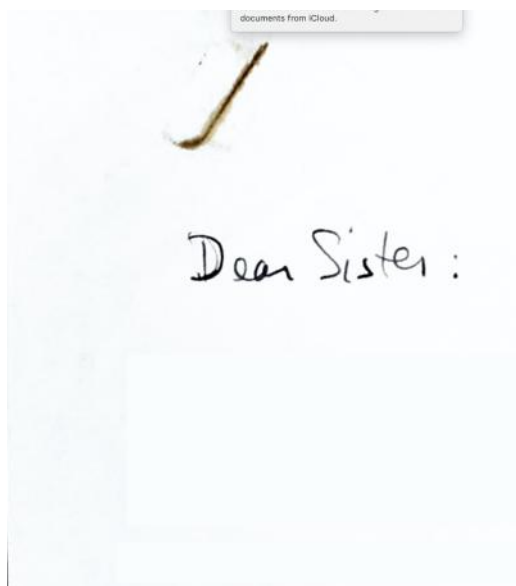
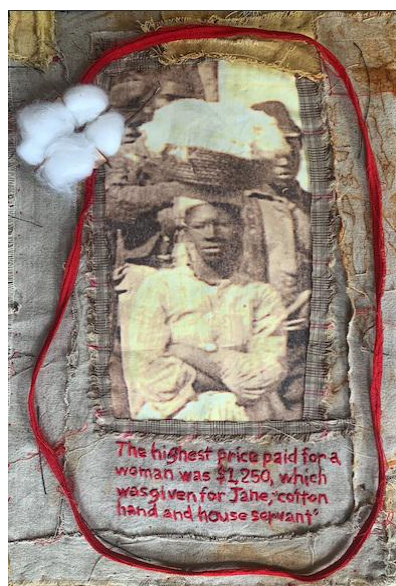


## RU Exhibition: Storying

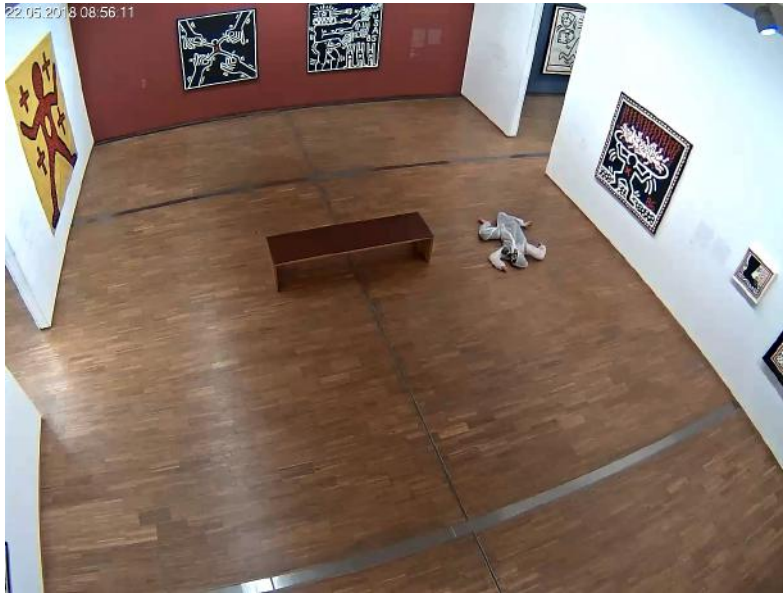

During this talk, [Nika Ham](#) will disclose how her ongoing project, *Dance with Bentham* dwells on the intersection between lens-based and performance art. Together with the curator [Maryam Ghoreishi](#) the artist will examine how multiple concepts are embodied in this process-based project and their unfolding.

*Dance with Bentham* was first launched by Nika Ham in 2017 when she worked as a part time attendant at the Museum of Modern Art in Ljubljana and has since been performed in many other institutions and galleries where the part time positions held by the artist were inherent to her artistic process. In this project, the artist performs playful movements in front of surveillance cameras and then transforms the filmed footage which is generally not accessible to the public through stop-motion animations and image sequences. The new narratives that emerge in her videos draw a contrast between expected and unexpected, conventional and unconventional. Ham's actions—which are usually in correspondence with the space that she

occupies temporarily— disrupt the conventional image of those spaces and open up a possibility of different interpretations.
