2020 curator-in-residence Abdullah Qureshi (Finland/Canada) has organized *Mythological Migrations: Chapter 2: The Darkroom*, an artistic component of his doctoral dissertation at Aalto University in Finland. *The Darkroom* is a multidisciplinary virtual exhibit that looks at: cruising, erotic spaces, and practices traditionally understood as sexually promiscuous, and thus, morally rejected or pushed to the peripheries by the dominant heteronormative society, challenging and re-claiming histories of orientalism, activating and disrupting spaces otherwise considered dangerous, and opening up the possibilities of sex and gender expression from queer, Muslim, and migratory perspectives. The four-day program includes artistic contributions, films, and talks, accessible on

www.mythologicalmigrations.com from October 28 - 31.

RU alumna Regina Parra (2018, Brazil) is one of five artists-in-residence at the recently reopened Watermill Center in New York. The artists will spend several weeks living and working on-site and developing new work. Parra works primarily in painting, video, and the performing arts around the issues of resistance and subversion.
